He grew up in Honolulu, and graduated om Punahou School. He received his B.S. degree from Stanford niversity and his medical degree from the University of Hawaii hool of Medicine. Dr. Mankani did his general surgery residency at e University of Chicago, where he also completed a fellowship in Irrn surgery. He then went on to Georgetown University where he mpleted his plastic and reconstructive surgical residency. His llowship in hand and microsurgery was done at Brigham and omen's Hospital; his clinical fellowship in surgery at Harvard; and 5 craniofacial and skeletal disease fellowship at the NIH.

. Mankani's area of clinical expertise was in Plastic and constructive Surgery, Hand Surgery, and Burn Surgery.
